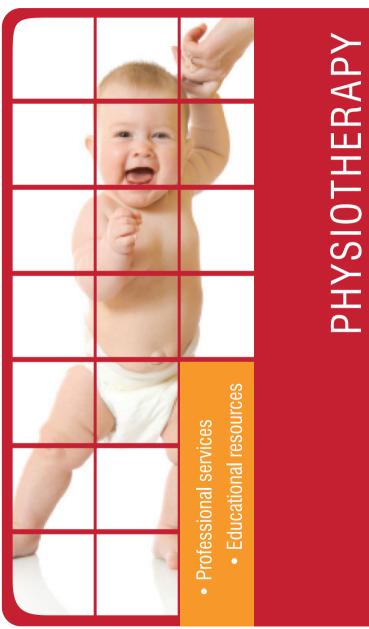

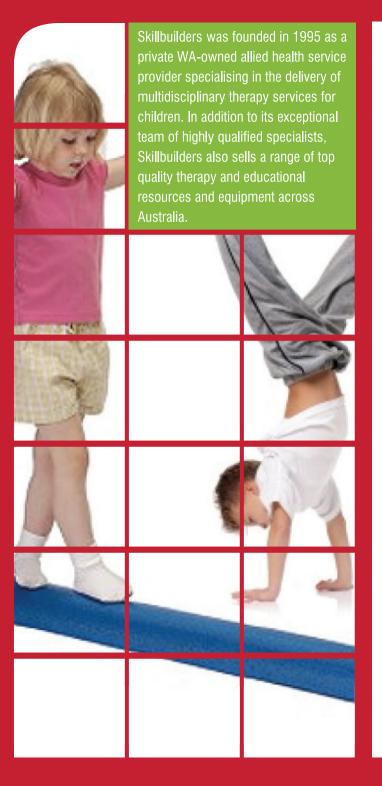

PHYSIOTHERAPY SERVICES AT SKILLBUILDERS INCLUDE:

WHEN TO SEEK PHYSIOTHERAPY:

Physiotherapists can help babies and children learn to improve the quality of their movement. Your child will benefit if any of the following are present;

- · Motor skill delays e.g. crawling, walking
- · Motor co-ordination difficulties
- Specific conditions, eg. Cerebral palsy, developmental disabilities, motor skills related to autism
- Positional turning of the head, torticollis or plagiocephaly in babies
- Musculo-skeletal problems (unusual walking or running patterns, toe-walking and posture etc)
- General fitness and community sport participation
